LISTEN TO THE EPISODE: Christian Engagement in Societal Issues

READ Romans 13:1-7, <u>1 Peter 2:13-17</u>, Romans 3:10-12, James 2:1-9

REFLECTION After listening, consider the following questions:

- Review the five stances Rheinhold Niebuhr says Christians take regarding their engagement with culture that hosts Darrell Delaney and Scott Hoezee discussed in segment 1. Which stance seems most in line with your current perspective? What about the perspective of your church? Why?
- In your context, is it difficult or easy to view government authorities as God's servants or to "give to Caesar what is Caesar's"? Why?
- Reflecting on Abraham Kuyper's "sphere sovereignty" notion, Scott says, "You don't want to treat the government like it is supposed to be the Church. You don't expect the government to do the work of the Church, and you don't expect the Church to do the work of the government." Do you think we struggle with this? Why or why not?
- In segment 3, Scott talks about showing more "generosity of spirit as we discern these things together." Where do you need to demonstrate more generosity of spirit?
