

# God's Mission

Ever since the fall of man in the Garden of Eden, God has been on a mission to redeem his people and restore his kingdom. Yet as Christians we regularly lament the state of the world in which we live; we question God's ways and his plans because they challenge our expectations and understandings. But God has already proven he is sovereign and that he has ultimate control; human will and human choices will not change his final outcome. We have hope because we can see that in Christ, God fulfilled the promises he made to restore and rebuild Israel through the prophet Isaiah and that he will use the most unlikely people as the means to accomplish his mission.

**AWARENESS** Before listening reflect on what you already know or understand about topics we'll cover in the episode.

- When you find yourself lamenting the brokenness of our world, what gives you hope?
- How would you define the word sovereign? What does it mean that God is sovereign?

**REFLECTION** After listening, consider the following questions:

- As believers, we are living in a foreign land. Our ultimate home is the kingdom of God and we wait for its full inauguration here on earth. It's why we lament the brokenness of the world and long for things to be the way God designed and intended. Considering this reality, how can we relate to the prophet speaking to the Israelites in exile, even if in our present circumstances we aren't refugees or exiles ourselves?
- When have you been tempted to question God's revealed plans or the people through whom he chooses to work? Or when have you been tempted to attribute an event to God's wrath? Why was this a temptation? What did you learn from the experience? What does this Isaiah passage suggest we should say or do in these circumstances?
- Consider the behavior, beliefs, and values of our society, what aspects do you find concerning? Regarding these concerns, where do you find comfort that things do not happen simply by chance, but that ultimately God has control and can work through believers and unbelievers alike, no matter the individual's own motivations?
- Are you at all afraid of what God will ask of you if you fully dedicate yourself to him and surrender so that he can work through you to accomplish his mission? Why or why not?
