

Learning from the Sins of King David

What was I thinking? How did I let this happen? We usually ask these questions when a choice we make leads to unwanted consequences. In the biblical story of David and Bathsheba, we find a sobering reminder of the destructive power of sin and our deep need for God's grace. In his complacency and desperation, David compounds sin upon sin in a series of unsuccessful attempts to use his power as king to cover up his wrongdoing. Our study of David's fall and the consequences of his actions illuminates our path toward honesty, repentance, and a life that pleases the Lord. Ultimately, we'll discover hope that only God can provide.

AWARENESS Before listening reflect on what you already know or understand about topics we'll cover in the episode.

- How would you tell the story of David and Bathsheba to someone who has never heard it?
- Do you think some conditions or mindsets make humans more susceptible to sin? Why or why not?

REFLECTION After listening, consider the following questions:

- Have you ever compounded a sin by trying to cover or fix it like David?
- Why do you think we often first try to fix situations or stave off consequences ourselves rather than repenting and asking for forgiveness and help?
- In 1 Samuel 16:7, when the prophet Samuel is preparing to anoint the next king of Israel, God tells him, "The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." The story of David and Bathsheba reminds us that God sees both the good *and* the bad in our hearts. What does this truth mean to you?
- At the end of segment 2, host Darrell Delaney says, "How often do I justify small compromises, assuming there are no real consequences because nobody saw them? How often do I try to cover up mistakes instead of confessing them? I realize this story is a way for us to confront these things in our lives...the capacity we have for sin..." How would you answer his questions?
