REFLECTION After listening, consider the following questions:

- Why is *showing* our love for God important for our faith?
- What does it mean to you that God desires your love, that he invites you to love him and be in relationship with him? How is this different than if he had created us to serve and obey him, but did not include love or relationship in the equation?
- Are there different ways to love God with your heart vs. with your soul vs. with your mind? In what ways do you love God with your whole being?

And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.
