

# Only Glorify Jesus

As humans, we almost can't help but make comparisons. But when comparing distracts us from what's true and important, then it becomes problematic and unhelpful. The Christians in Corinth struggled with a comparison problem. As Paul addressed their problem in 1 Corinthians, he offered a valuable perspective on power, authority, and leadership in the church, and a vital reminder that Christ is the foundation upon which we should build all things. Together, let's study Paul's guidance to the Corinthians to gain a better understanding of what it means to dwell in Christ and live and work as believers today.

**REFLECTION** After listening, consider the following questions:

- The Corinthians put their leaders on a pedestal. Paul corrected their thinking by telling them the message is more important than the messenger. Can you think of modern-day examples of leaders being put on a pedestal?
- In the first segment, host Darrell Delaney said, “The point is that God is the one who makes growth happen, spiritually speaking, and we need to make sure that we keep God central to the message.” How does Paul's gardening metaphor in [1 Corinthians 3:5-9](#) emphasize his point that it is God who causes the growth?
- Jesus is the foundation, and Christians are God's temple. From the beginning to the end, God works through his people. How does God's gracious message that you are his sacred temple affect the way you live today?
- The smartest ideas in the world are foolish in God's sight because they always rely on human ability. True wisdom comes to the one who relies fully on the God who gives wisdom. What experiences in your life have reaffirmed this truth and taught you to rely on him?
