Paul's Third Journey: Strengthening and Encouraging Believers

Not long after completing his second missionary journey, the apostle Paul left Antioch again to start his third missionary journey. Luke records the events of this trip in Acts chapters 18-21. This journey was marked by faith, courage, and love. Paul spent four to five years revisiting many of the cities where he had planted churches on his previous journeys, teaching, strengthening, and encouraging the believers. By studying Paul's incredible third journey, with all its challenges, opportunities, and heartbreaking goodbyes, we learn how to live with the same bold trust and purpose in our own lives.

- Have you ever needed to "step out in faith"? What was that experience like?
- Do you think you are—or can be—bold? Why or why not?

READ Acts 18:23–21:17

REFLECTION After listening, consider the following questions:

- The apostle Paul discipled many believers along his journeys. In Acts 18:24-28, Priscilla and Aquila mentor Apollos. Who has been a notable mentor to you in your faith? Have you had the opportunity to disciple or mentor someone? What gets in the way of you teaching or discipling others?
- Paul was committed to preaching the gospel of Jesus anywhere and everywhere. In segment 3, host Darrell Delaney said, "Paul is committed to being obedient, and that is more important to him than his own comfort and the security of his life." Can you say this about yourself? Why or why not?
- In segment 3, host Scott Hoezee tells us that we, like Paul, need "to stay tuned to the voice of the Holy Spirit." How do you keep yourself in tune with the Holy Spirit?
- Paul strengthened and encouraged each community of believers he visited, but they also uplifted and supported him. Do you have a community of believers from whom you receive love, encouragement, accountability, and support?
