

# Spiritual Priorities in Haggai and Zechariah

Life is full of struggles and challenges. Even as we follow God's lead, the way forward isn't always straight. The Israelites felt this truth acutely when they finally returned home after living in exile in Babylon. As the people began to rebuild, God provided guidance and help through the prophets Haggai and Zechariah. **REFLECTION** After listening, consider the following questions:

- After reading [Haggai 1:1-8](#), host Darrell Delaney points out that God's people have a "priority issue." God provides for us, giving us the ability to work to feed and shelter ourselves. Yet this pursuit takes much of our focus. Reread [Haggai 1:1-8](#). What in this passage helps us learn from Israel's experience and better prioritize our lives to honor God?
- God has not called *us* to build a temple but to share the Good News. How does Haggai encourage you as you do God's work today?
- As they study [Zechariah chapters 1 and 2](#), Darrell and host Scott Hoezee recognize that God wants to live among his people and be their God. Are there other biblical passages that show God's desire to be with his people?
- [Zechariah 14:20-21](#) tells us everything will be holy and devoted to the Lord, even utensils used for cooking. How does this truth impact your perspective on your daily life?
