When will the world come to an end? It's a question every generation asks. READ [Matthew 25:1-13](#)

REFLECTION After listening, consider the following questions:

- How are parables of judgment, like the Ten Virgins also a sign of God's grace? Why can believers take comfort from them?
- In his book *The Lord of Parables*, LeRoy Lawson makes this observation about how Jesus teaches and talks about the last day: "*He [Jesus] insists that his followers experience normal lives, living expectantly but without anxiety about tomorrow*" (p. 91). What does the parable of the Ten Virgins teach us about living expectantly? Is it easy for you to live without anxiety about Christ's return and God's judgment? Why or why not?
- In segment 3 hosts Dave Bast and Scott Hoezee share that watching, or being prepared, for the Lord's coming means living our lives close to God and being faithful in our daily tasks. How have you been faithful today?
- In what ways does this parable help you live with the mystery of the last day? How does it help you talk with someone trying to decipher the Bible to figure out the timing of the last day? What could you say?
