

# Trusting God When Evil Abounds

At some point in life, each of us will find ourselves in a situation that is simply unfair. We try our best to live moral lives that honor God, but sometimes it feels like the world wants to punish us for it. When we experience this kind of injustice, it can lead us to ask, “Why do bad things happen to good people?” And when unfair circumstances threaten our way of life, it can be tempting to compromise our beliefs and values in order to protect ourselves and preserve our way of life. But the Bible is clear that God is with us in those difficult circumstances. The story of Daniel in the Lion’s Den is a reminder that we are not on our own and that God is able to deliver his people. Join us in studying Daniel 6 and discover the courage to trust God and remain steadfast in our faith, even when evil seems to be winning.

**READ** [Daniel 6](#)

**REFLECTION** After listening, consider the following questions:

- Daniel used his God-given gifts and talents to serve the Babylonian kings with excellence. His example reminds us that we can honor God in all kinds of jobs, roles, and settings. Think about all the different ways you serve in your life: how can you honor God in these roles?
- Throughout the book of Daniel, we witness how Daniel did not hide his faith. Daniel lived his life according to his beliefs even when it made him stand out. Reflect on the life and ministry of Jesus. How is Daniel similar to Jesus? How did Jesus stand out from other religious leaders by what he said and did? How might you live out your faith like Daniel and Jesus?
- King Darius regretted making his decree as soon as he found out it meant Daniel would be thrown into the lions’ den. What sort of character traits and practices can protect us from being manipulated the way King Darius was? Have you had someone try to manipulate you or your faith for their own ends? How did you realize what was happening?
- In segment 3, hosts Darrell Delaney and Scott Hoezee describe the events in Daniel 6 as the result of a “spiral of evil.” What did they mean by that? Have you personally experienced or witnessed something’s negative impact spread to other relationships and situations?

## CONCLUSION

Read Galatians 5:13-26 and compare the descriptions of living according to the flesh versus living in step with the Spirit. What are the consequences for a community of people who live according to the flesh? What about a community who lives in step with the Spirit? Though evil deeds and plans can spiral out of control, goodness can also grow and spread exponentially. Reflect on a time that you saw goodness multiply and spread throughout a community. Which of the fruits of the Spirit did you see? Conclude your time of reflection in prayer, offering God praise and thanks for this testimony of his grace and seeking the Holy Spirit's help in cultivating the faith to trust God in all circumstances of your own life.

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
