Waiting for the Second Coming

"What happens to my body when I die? What about my soul?" "What is heaven like?" Curiosity about the afterlife is natural. We like to know what we can look forward to, what to expect. We seek comfort when death separates us from our loved ones; we'd like to know if they're still connected to us somehow. Find out what the Bible says happens to believers who die before Christ comes again, an existence theologians call the intermediate state.

AWARENESS Before listening reflect on what you already know or understand about topics we'll cover in the episode.

- Why do you think books and movies about near-death experiences and testimonies about heaven are popular? Have they ever interested you? Why or why not?
- With respect to life after death, have you ever heard the term "intermediate state"? What is its definition or if you had to guess, what would you guess it is?



LISTEN TO THE EPISODE: Waiting for the Second Coming

READ Romans 8:35-39, 2 Corinthians 5:1-10

REFLECTION After listening, consider the following questions:

- The majority of Christians believe that the soul of a believer dwells with God immediately after death. However, there are other theories about the intermediate state. Consider some of the alternate theories that hosts Dave Bast and Scott Hoezee mention in the first segment of the program (materialist/extinctionist, soul sleep, purgatory, universalism). Where have you heard them before or seen evidence of them in pop culture?
- Why is it comforting to know, and be assured, that believers spend their intermediate state (the time between death and Christ's return) with God?
- In segment two, Scott says that your "spiritual address" right now on earth is *IN CHRIST* and death doesn't change that address. What does that mean to you?
- Would you feel comfortable talking about heaven and life after death with someone who had questions? Why or why not? If you feel ill-prepared, what else do you feel like you need to know?

Reflect on the idea that the reason we love our worldly home is because it sometimes looks a little like heaven. How does that affect your perspective on life after death? Write down your thoughts, reflections, and reactions.
